23.6 $E = c^2 \Delta m = (3.0 \times 10^8)^2(4.0 \times 10^{-29}) = 3.6 \times 10^{-12} \text{ J}.$

23.7 Energy is released whenever the binding energy per nucleon *increases* (moves towards the iron peak). Light nuclei climb the curve by fusing together; heavy nuclei climb it by splitting apart. In both cases the products are more tightly bound, so energy is given out.
