You must be able to

- explain that image quality is part of the grade
- photograph with even light, sharp focus, true colour
- avoid **keystoning** 梯形失真 and glare
- keep files at high **resolution** 分辨率

Method — Presentation matters

How work is photographed affects its score — a great piece shot badly loses marks.
Image quality is part of the grade.

Method — Good photography

Use **even lighting**, **sharp focus**, **true colour**, and a plain background; crop tight and shoot square-on to avoid **keystoning**.

Method — Files

Follow the required formats and keep **resolution** high so detail is not lost.
