2.1 writer; audience; purpose; subject; context.

2.2 the situation or event that made the text necessary at that moment.

2.3 it explains the writer's urgency and often the argument's whole shape, since the text is a response to it.

2.4 the subject is what the text is about; the purpose is what the writer wants it to accomplish.

2.5 almost every text informs; it does not say what the writer wants the reader to do or believe afterwards.

2.6 any one of: common ground must be established first; concessions must be made; assumed agreement must be argued for. \
