Answers

Work through these after you have tried the questions yourself.

2.1 it uses them as evidence for its own position, rather than reporting what each source says.

2.2 it explains how a text achieves its purpose for its audience; it does not evaluate whether the argument is right.

2.3 your own position on the question, with your own specific evidence from anywhere you know well.

2.4 it is not a specific case, so there is nothing a reader could check or that could fail to be true.

2.5 synthesis - summarising sources in turn; rhetorical analysis - evaluating whether the argument is right; argument - analysing the prompt's style instead of taking a position.

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
