Each answer shows the steps, then the **result**.

2.1

- identify details that, in combination, enable a claim that can be made and defended about an aspect of the text

2.2

- a poem's evidence is small, so a claim usually rests on two or three details working together

2.3

(a)

- a statement of what in the quotation supports the claim, identifying the words carrying the weight

(b)

- the claim and the textual evidence that defends it

- small units of text

- identifying the operative words

- a claim requiring defense; a first detail identified precisely; a second detail identified precisely; the two related to the claim rather than listed
