Each answer shows the steps, then the **result**.

2.1

- description creates expectations for behavior, and meeting or failing them affects the reader's interpretation

2.2

- the speaker's perspective on the compared character and possibly something innate about the compared character

2.3

(a)

- the same character at two points supplies two pieces of evidence, which is how change is demonstrated rather than asserted

(b)

- that character's motives

3.1 A

- the reader's interpretation

3.2 A

- the narrator's perspective

3.3

(a)

- the speaker's view of the other, and possibly something true of the other

(b)

- test the description against the character's own actions elsewhere; where they agree it is evidence about the character, where they diverge it is evidence about the speaker
