- coordination illustrates a balance or equality between ideas; subordination illustrates an imbalance or inequality

2.2

- a subordinated clause is marked as less important, so placing the main point there tells the reader to weight it less than intended

2.3

(a)

- a semicolon claims a balance between two clauses that a comma does not

- which idea is the main one, and does it sit in the main clause

- imbalance

- less important

(a)

- the grammar weights the claim as concessive rather than central

- move the claim into the main clause and subordinate the concession instead
