Each answer shows the steps, then the **result**.

2.1

- something about that character's own values, through their words or actions

2.2

- any four of: that character; other characters; events in the plot; conflicts; the perspective of the narrator, character or speaker; setting

2.3

(a)

- at a resolution a character has nothing left to gain by concealment, so the response is unusually direct evidence of what they value

(b)

- responses may be inconsistent with previously established behaviours or perspectives

3.1 A

- their own values

3.2 A

- anticipated

3.3

(a)

- a value the earlier caution was protecting or concealing

(b)

- as evidence rather than as an error, and as a reason to reread the earlier caution in its light
