Each answer shows the steps, then the **result**.

2.1

- effective when commentary explains a logical relationship between evidence and claim; sufficient when quantity and quality aptly support the line of reasoning

2.2

- the text is not available, so evidence must be recalled accurately rather than located

2.3

(a)

- a small number of specific moments — a decision, an image, an exchange — known precisely

(b)

- forming the line of reasoning first and then identifying evidence

3.1 A

- admissible

3.2 A

- reasoning first

3.3

- a claim requiring defense; a first moment described precisely; a second moment described precisely; both related to the claim rather than listed
