- You have written an essay whose paragraphs each made sense alone.
- You know a list of points is not an argument.

New ideas

Read these first. Each idea has a short worked example. Then do the Practice below.

■ 1 A thesis

A **thesis** 论点 expresses an interpretation and requires defence through evidence and a line of reasoning. It need not list the points or the literary elements to be analysed.

Worked example. 'This essay will discuss imagery, structure and tone' announces topics and takes no position.

■ 2 A line of reasoning

A **line of reasoning** 推理线索 is the logical sequence of claims defending the thesis. Because it is a sequence, the order is itself part of the argument.

Worked example. If two paragraphs can be swapped with nothing lost, they were a list.

■ 3 Commentary

Commentary 评述 explains the logical relationship between the thesis and the evidence. Two students can quote identically and reach opposite conclusions; the difference is entirely in the commentary.

Worked example. Evidence does not interpret itself, so the argument is made in the explanation.

Watch out: Restating a line in plain words is paraphrase, not commentary. Paraphrase says what the line says; commentary says what it does and why that supports the claim.
