- rings of land use around a central CBD, from transition/working-class to wealthier commuter zones outward

2.2

- the sector model uses wedges along transport routes instead of complete rings

- the multiple nuclei model

(b)

- growth is anchored on several nodes, not a single CBD

- wedges along transport routes = sector model

- the concentric zone model centres on the CBD
