Objective

1 Worked examples

Study these first. Each one shows the method for a question type used later.

■ What an EM wave is

An electromagnetic wave is oscillating electric and magnetic fields, at right angles to each other and to the direction of travel. It needs **no** medium.

■ Speed

Every EM wave travels at $c = 3.0 \times 10^8 \text{ m s}^{-1}$ in a vacuum.

■ The spectrum (increasing frequency)

radio $\rightarrow$ microwave $\rightarrow$ infrared $\rightarrow$ **visible** $\rightarrow$ ultraviolet $\rightarrow$ X-ray $\rightarrow$ gamma.
