1 Worked examples

Study these first. Each one shows the method for a question type used later.

■ Why normal?

Because the sampling distribution of $\hat{p}$ is approximately **normal** (when conditions are met), we can use z -values to build confidence intervals and run tests about a population proportion.

■ The large counts condition

The normal model applies when $np \geq 10$ **and** $n(1 - p) \geq 10$. Inference then uses the sample to estimate the unknown population proportion p .
