Method — 1920

By 1920, a majority of the U.S. population lived in urban centers, which offered new economic opportunities for women, international migrants, and internal migrants.

Method — New art

Migration gave rise to new forms of art and literature that expressed ethnic and regional identities, such as the Harlem Renaissance movement.

Method — Five controversies

Americans debated gender roles, modernism, science, religion, and issues related to race and immigration.

Method — Both at once

The same decade produced the Harlem Renaissance and the immigration quotas of 7.6. Expression and restriction are responses to the same demographic change, which is why the CED puts them in one unit.
