- British attempts at tighter control and colonial resolve leading to independence and war; the Revolution's ideals inspiring new experiments with forms of government; migration and competition intensifying conflicts among peoples and nations

- the war was the product of both British policy and colonial resolve; an answer with only the first removes the colonists' agency

- they are two attempts rather than a plan and its execution
