- official restrictions grew, as anxiety about radicalism led to a Red Scare and attacks on labor activism and immigrant culture

- quotas restricting immigration, particularly from southern and eastern Europe, and increased barriers to Asian immigration

- they escaped segregation, racial violence and limited economic opportunity and found new opportunities but still encountered discrimination

- increased demand for war production and labor
