■ Three movements

Latino, American Indian, and Asian American movements continued to demand social and economic equality and a redress of past injustices.

■ Two more

Feminist and LGBTQ+ activists mobilized behind claims for legal, economic, and social equality. Three kinds of equality, named separately.

■ Counterculture feminists

Feminists who participated in the counterculture of the 1960s rejected many of the social, economic, and political values of their parents' generation and advocated changes in sexual norms.

■ Redress

Equality concerns the future; redress concerns the past. A demand for redress says that a wrong already done requires remedy, which is a different claim from a demand for equal treatment from now on.
