Method — The technologies

Radio communication, cellular communication and the internet, as well as **air travel and shipping containers**. A shipping container beside the internet is a reminder that logistics is a communication technology too.

Method — Distance

They **reduced the problem of geographic distance**. Not abolished — reduced, and as a problem rather than as a fact.

Method — Birth control

More effective forms of birth control gave women greater control over fertility, transformed reproductive practices, and contributed to declining rates of fertility in much of the world. Three effects, from the individual to the demographic.

Method — The Green Revolution

It and commercial agriculture **increased productivity and sustained the earth's growing population as it spread chemically and genetically modified forms of agriculture**. Medical innovations including **vaccines and antibiotics** increased the ability of humans to survive and live longer.
