5. **lungs**

Pulmonary = to the lungs for oxygen.

6. **True**

Mammals pump blood twice per circuit.

7. **True**

It pumps blood to the whole body at high pressure.

8. **True**

Arteries are defined by direction, not oxygen content.

9. **True**

No nucleus and a biconcave shape suit oxygen transport.

10. **systemic**

Systemic = to the body; pulmonary = to the lungs.
