2.1

(a)

- **However** / **Even so** / **Nevertheless**

(b)

- **As a result** / **Therefore** / **Consequently**

(c)

- **However** / **On the other hand** / **Even so**

2.2

- any sensible five-paragraph plan, one idea per line
- a clear opening that **states the suggestion**
- at least **two developed reasons** in separate lines
- a closing line that **asks for a response**

2.3

- purpose first, then reasons in order, then the money saved
- **B, C, E, D, A**

3.1

- any **two**: several unrelated ideas rather than one; science-block and canteen belong to a different topic; no linking words; the final sentence is never developed

3.2

- a single controlling idea; at least two supporting details; at least two linking devices; accurate sentences
- model: "Sport matters more to this school than its timetable suggests. Our football team does well, and exercise helps students concentrate in the lessons that follow it. **However**, there is no club for anyone who does not make the team. **As a result**, many students who would happily train twice a week do nothing at all."
