Each answer shows the steps, then the **result**.

2.1

(a)

- named film or detail plus a reaction
- e.g. “I finally saw the film everyone has been quoting at me for a month, and I still do not understand the ending — I may have to watch it again.”

(b)

- named teacher plus a reaction
- e.g. “The new teacher, Ms Adeyemi, learned all thirty names in one lesson, which none of us expected and which makes it much harder to hide.”

2.2

- combine into two sentences of varied length
- e.g. “I went to the market to buy fruit, but the prices had gone up so much that I came home with three apples and a bad mood.”

3.1

- any **three**: every point mentioned but none developed; “good”/“nice” used for three different things; no reaction or opinion; no closing question; one block with no paragraphs

3.2

- **content (3)**: each point developed with specific detail
- **language (3)**: varied sentence length, precise vocabulary replacing “good” and “nice”, clear paragraphing, a closing that invites a reply
