TOEFL iBT

1. The test adjusts to your ability level

The test adjusts to each student's level, so test time and items may vary.

2. 5.5

The average is 5.25, and an average ending in .25 rounds UP to the next half point.

3. 5.5

The overall score is the average rounded to the nearest half band: 5.25 becomes 5.5.

4. 5

5.125 is nearer to 5 than to 5.5, so it rounds down. ETS gives this exact example.

5. True

1 to 1.5 is A1, 4 to 4.5 is B2, 5 to 5.5 is C1 and 6 is C2.

6. No — one section is below the 4.5 floor

The overall is fine and the 4 in one section is not. A section floor is a requirement, not a guideline — this is why you work on the lowest number.

7. 120

During the change-over, reports carry the CEFR level, the 1 to 6 scores and a comparable 0 to 120 score.

8. False

ETS computes the comparable score and publishes no formula. Until January 2028 it is printed on your report — read it there.
